The last of a generation, Ann Bussell LaChance, known to her family as Anna, age 93, a long-time Brevard County resident, passed away peacefully at Wuesthoff Hospice and Pallataive Care in Rockledge, Thursday, August 20, 2020.

She was born Sep. 8, 1926 in Washington, DC, the youngest daughter of Richard Harold Bussell and May Eleanor Eshleman. She grew up in Washington, DC where she graduated from Anacostia Junior-Senior High school in June 1942.

Shortly after, with her mother and in support of the war effort, she moved to Orange, NJ. Here she worked for the Monroe Calculator Company and then NJ Bell Yellow Pages among other endeavors. At Lost Lakes she met her best friend, soul mate and future husband, Joe Pault. They spent 26 happy and fun years together before his passing in 2016.

For the past 3 years, Ann had settled into "independent living" at The Brennity in Viera.

Our mom was strong-willed, determined, independent, even feisty and sometimes tough but she had a big heart. She genuinely loved life, meeting new people, dancing, travel, family and being in the company of her numerous friends, many of whom have already passed.
